

1. 3-yrs Diploma in Motion Picture Photography

Qualification for admission: Passed 10 +2 in science or equivalent

2. 3-yrs Diploma in Audiography and Sound Engineering

Qualification for admission: Passed 10 +2 in science or equivalent

3. 3-yrs Diploma in Film and Video Editing

Qualification for admission: Passed 10+2 in any discipline or equivalent

4. 1-yr Certificate course I Applied acting (Film &TV)

Qualification for admission: Passed 10+2 in any discipline or equivalent

Admission:

Submission of application:

Candidates who fulfill the required qualifications and specifications should submit their applications for admission only in the prescribed form enclosed with the prospectus. Application complete in all respects should reach the address on or before the last date of submission as mentioned in the

admission advertisement. The Admission Advertisement normally appears in all leading newspapers published from Guwahati in the last week of April in every year.

Written Examination and viva-voce:

All eligible candidates have to appear a written examination and vivavoce conducted by the State Council for Technical Education, Assam.





The academic process for an academic session of the Institute normally commences in the month of April/May.

Class hours:

Teaching hours are normally 10.00 - 17.00 hours with a lunch-break, though this can vary according to the demand of the curriculum. During productions early calls, evening and night works are likely to be required.

Attendance in class:

Students failing to attend a minimum of 80% of attendance in any subject shall not be allowed to appear in the examination.
